Note: Top 7 Mistakes to Avoid Daily

1 Rushing Platform Exams
Read platform guidelines 2x before taking any exam
Practice with sample questions when available
Aim for 90%+ scores, not just passing
☐ Take screenshots of results for portfolio/LinkedIn
Pro Tip: Failing exams locks you out for 30 days. Better to spend 2 hours studying than lose a month of potential earnings (\$200-\$500).

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2 Misinterpreting Task Guidelines
Read ALL guidelines thoroughly before startingHighlight and note edge cases (ambiguous examples)
 Create a Notion/Excel summary for each project Double-check 10% of labels against guidelines
Pro Tip: Misinterpreting guidelines can drop accuracy by 10%. Always clarify unclear instructions before submitting work.
3 Ignoring QA Feedback
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4 Overloading with Too Many Tasks
Start with ONE platform, work 20-40 hours/week
Use Trello/calendar to track task deadlines
Prioritize high-pay projects (\$15/hour+)
Work 90-min sprints with 10-min breaks
Pro Tip:
Missing quotas can cut earnings by 15%. Better to excel at fewer tasks than fail at many.
5 Neglecting Portfolio Development
Create 2-3 mock projects using public datasets
Use Label Studio/CVAT to annotate samples
Write 200-word case studies for each project
Upload portfolio to LinkedIn Featured section
Pro Tip:
Portfolios increase job offers by 30%. Showcase 95%+ accuracy with real examples.
6 Failing to Upskill Early
Complete free courses (Kaggle's 6-hour Python)
Earn platform certifications (e.g., Remotasks LiDAR)
Learn basic JSON/CSV handling for QA tasks
☐ Target \$15-\$40/hour evaluator roles
Pro Tip:
Non-certified annotators earn 40% less. One \$50 certification can boost pay by \$8-10/hour.
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7 Under-Networking in the Industry
Join X communities (@AlJobsNow) for job alerts
Follow 10 industry leaders for insights
Engage in Reddit (r/datascience) discussions
Comment on LinkedIn AI posts to build visibility
Pro Tip:
Networked annotators access 25% more high-pay opportunities. One connection can lead to \$25-40/hour roles.
